



In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) eBook

WHAT IS IVF?

In vitro fertilization (IVF) is a method of assisted reproduction that involves combining an egg with sperm outside the body. If the egg fertilizes and begins cell division, 1-2 of the resulting embryos are transferred into the woman's uterus. IVF bypasses the fallopian tubes.

WHAT'S INVOLVED?

IVF is a three-part process consisting of 1st, egg retrieval from a female donor or patient's ovaries; 2nd, fertilization of the eggs with sperm and incubation inside our lab; 3rd, transfer of embryo into the female patient's uterus where it will hopefully implant in the uterine lining and develop.

There were over 3.9 million births from IVF in 2014.



WHAT ARE MY CHANCES AT SUCCESS?

Many factors affect your particular chances at success. But, to gain some perspective, consider the national average for IVF resulting in pregnancy is about 36% per cycle.

The good news is, our success rates are well above the national average.

Understanding these rates may help you think about planning more than one cycle, and feel less discouraged if the 1st one doesn't work.

WHAT ABOUT INSURANCE?

Our Financial Coordinator may speak with you right away. If not, she will contact you within a couple days to speak with you about costs, coverage and any available programs to help limit out-of-pocket expenses so you will be able to plan for multiple cycles if necessary.

HEALTH

Health conditions such as polycystic ovarian syndrome, endometriosis, irregular menstrual cycles, or abnormal hormone levels could be keeping you from getting or staying pregnant.

AGE MATTERS

Most women hit their fertile peak between the ages of 23 and 31, though the rate at which women conceive begins to dip slightly in their late 20s. Around age 31, fertility starts to drop more quickly until you hit 35 or so, and then significantly drops thereafter.

Women who are under 30 trying for 12 months without success and women who are over 30 trying for 6 months with no success should check in with a fertility specialist right away.
