Reversal vs IVF

In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) makes more sense for some women.

The costs for IVF are about the same.

In successful reversals, the birth rate within 3 years of the surgery is approximately 50%.

By comparison, the birth rate for IVF is comparable following just 1 attempt.

IVF is far less invasive than surgery and does not require hospitalization or an extended recovery period.

IVF leaves the tubal ligation in tact, maintaining control over family planning without resorting to the use of contraception.

Tubal Ligation Reversal

When being evaluated as a tubal reversal candidate, a specialist will look at the sperm quality of the male partner, tubal status, status of other possible pelvic conditions, female age, and egg quantity and quality.

In general, good candidates for tubal reversal are women who had only small parts of their fallopian tubes removed, or whose tubes were closed using rings or clips.

Tubal reversal surgery is done in a hospital or outpatient center. You will be given general anesthesia, which means you will be pain-free during surgery and unaware of the operation taking place.

Pregnancy Afterwards

Not every woman is able to become pregnant after tubal reversal.

Age plays an important role in the ability to become pregnant after tubal reversal. Older women are much less likely than younger woman to become pregnant after this procedure.

Underlying infertility issues may also limit chances at success.
